WHITES

RIESLING / GEWÜRZTRAMINER / CHENIN BLANC

These fresh, clean whites are rarely oaked so as to showcase their incredible aromatics and refreshing acidity. Depending on the style and the region that the wine originates, these wines can be decadently sweet or bone dry. However, because of their ever present vibrant acidity, even the sweet wines are balanced and never cloying. The amazing interplay between sweet and tart will tingle the taste buds and make it all but impossible to take just one sip.

SAUVIGNON BLANC / PINOT GRIGIO

Often the antithesis to Chardonnay, these two varietals show up just about everywhere wine is grown. Both are driven by a core of citrusy freshness, with Sauvignon Blanc leaning toward grapefruit, and Pinot Grigio to melon tones. American, Australian and South American versions tend to be more fruity, while the European incarnations usually possess a stony minerality that can crackle with intensity. Either way, these wines compliment a wide variety of foods and are incredibly versatile on any table.

CHARDONNAY

The most well-traveled and well consumed of all wines can be whatever you want it to be. Blessed with a chameleon-like ability to adapt to any climate or style, Chardonnay is enjoyed the world over in as many styles as countries it is grown. Very easy to manipulate, it's natural state has green apple and pear tones, but it becomes the producer's choice to age in oak (to give baking spice and nutty aromas), to induce malolactic fermentation (for creamy texture and buttery flavors) and to lees stir (for density and richness). Or, do nothing at all and let it cleanse your palate with laser like acidity like great Chablis or Champagne. There's one for everybody... which may be why it's so popular.

SANGIOVESE / NEBBIOLO

Of all the myriad of wines that flow out of Italy each year, the most celebrated are certainly made with Sangiovese and Nebbiolo. From Nebbiolo comes Barolo and Barbaresco, the King and the Queen, respectively, of Italian wine. From Sangiovese, Chianti and its more muscular, deeper brother, Brunello di Montalcino. Both varietals are unmistakably Italian, bursting with red cherry fruit, fresh acidity and savory aromatics of flowers ranging from roses to violets. Unlike many other wines though, part of the authenticity and appeal is their rustic character, an indescribable flavor that sings of the Italian countryside and the farmers who cultivate these vines. Not to say that modern winemaking practices are absent from these wines, far from it in most cases. And yet... after all their accolades and acclaim, there is still a heart-warming charm and elegance in each bottle that stands immutable; a testament to the generations of hands unwilling to yield to the pressure of whatever tastes were currently popular, one which hopefully will be a legacy that will live for the generations to come...

In a culture where wine is an essential ingredient in every meal, the relative affordability, availability and increasingly high standard of quality of these two wines make them an ideal everyday selection.

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REDS

GARNACHA / TEMPRANILLO / SYRAH / SHIRAZ

Kissed by the sun is an appropriate term for these varietals... They flourish in warm, dry climates and are thrilled to hang around and soak up the rays. And like other sun lovers, they travel well... Their home climates of Spain and Southern France are still the benchmarks by which these varietals are judged, but world class wines are found anywhere there's a good beach. But don't be fooled, as simply enjoyable as they can be, when taken seriously they can convey layers of flavor and intensity that are breathtaking to behold. Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Côte Rotie and Hermitage in France; Rioja, Priorat and Ribera del Duero in Spain; all hallowed names in wine history. The Barossa Valley and McLaren Vale of Australia; most of California and even Washington State; all make incredible wines with cult-like followings. Although they can range from red-toned to black-toned, from earthy and savory to juicy and plump; they all share an ease to enjoy, a taste of berries and spice that can seduce even a stalwart non-believer.
